KOW THOUGHT TO HAVE BEEN MURDER

Wm. Ryder's Body is Disinterred and Autopsy Shows More Signs of Marder Than Suicide.

The inquest into the death of Wm Ryder of White's Mountain King's Co., who was shot on Oct. 11th about 80 rods from his own house, will convene tomorrow 26th

The post mortem examination es made on Friday.

Three distinct bullet wounds

were found in the man's breast one between the third and fourth ribs, and about two inches to the eft of the breast bone, and the other two under the left arm. The wounds were powder-marked showing that the shots must have been fired at close range. Three wounds showing where the bullets had come out were discovered in the back, one through the left shoulder blade, another just below the point of the left shoulder


