**Hopes Women Will Adopt This Habit As Well As Men**

Glass of hot water each morning helps us look and feel clean, sweet, fresh.

Happy, bright, alert - vigorous and vivacious - a good clear skin; a natural, rosy complexion and freedom from illness are assured only by clean, healthy blood. If only every woman and likewise every man could realize the wonders of the morning inside bath, what a gratifying change would take place.

Instead of the thousands of sickly, anaemic looking men, women and girls with pasty or muddy complexions; instead of the multitudes of nerve wrecks, run-downs, brain fags, and pessimists we should see a virile, optimistic throng of rosy-cheeked people everywhere.

**HAMBURG TO FOLLOW IN BAVARIA'S STEPS**

Copenhagen, April 9 - A political movement of great importance is imminent in the region of Hamburg reports from Berlin say. Doctors Herr and Hauffenberg, Spartan leaders, it is added, have almost succeeded in making themselves masters of the situation and in converting Hamburg and the region between Hamburg and Bremen into a Soviet republic.

**DENMARK DOING RELIEF WORK**  
 Copenhagen April 9 - Great efforts are being made in Denmark to help the suffering in Schleswig. A fund has been started already, now amounting to \$3,000,000.

**CANALS COST \$104,073,439 SINCE CONFEDERATION**  
 A despatch from Ottawa says: - A return tabled in the Commons gives the total expense on the canals of the Dominion since Confederation at \$104,073,439. The revenue during the period amounted to \$17,080,139. The Welland canal has been the greatest revenue producer. The earnings credited to it being \$6,212,308, while the Lachine canal holds second place with a total revenue since Confederation of \$2,345,406. In recent years no revenue has been collected from canals because of the abolition of the tolls.

**STRIKE CALLED IN BERLIN**

Thirty Thousand Troops Concentrated at Gates of City.  
 Paris, April 10 - A general strike has been proclaimed in Berlin and the suburbs of Spandau, advices received here say. Herr Noske, the Minister of Defence, is reported to have concentrated thirty thousand loyal troops at the gates of Berlin for use in case of trouble.

**HOME COMING OF THE 20TH BATTALION**

There will be a general meeting of the ex-members of the 20th Battalion at the Central Y. M. C. A., College Street, Toronto, on Thursday, 17th April, for the purpose of making arrangements for the home-coming of the Battalion and the formation of an Association.

A citizen who was at Niagara Falls, N.Y., and Buffalo yesterday states that in both places butter is being sold at 75 and 85 cents a pound. In this city 70 to 72 cents is the ruling price and the knowing ones fall to see that any reduction will occur until mid-summer, if then.

**POLAND DEMAND DANTZIG ALSO RICH GOAL FIELDS**

 Paris, April 9 - Ignace Paderewski, Polish Premier, was summoned before the Council of Four today to present the claims of Poland. The Polish Premier will urge that Dantzig must be given to Poland and Poland must have the coal fields of Teschen Silesia upon which, it is said, Polish industry depends.

**PEACE CONFERENCE CONSIDERS TWO PEACE TREATIES WITH GERMANY**

Establishment of Soviet Government at Munich May Make Two Peace Treaties Necessary.

Paris, April 9 - There is much apprehension in Peace Conference circles as to the effect the establishment of a Soviet Government at Munich may have on the conclusion of Peace. As the Munich Government appears from press despatches to be well established, the Peace Delegates are considering the eventual necessity of negotiating two Peace Treaties with Germany, one with Berlin and the other with Munich.

**GOVERNMENT TROOPS MARCH ON ESSEN**

Collision Between Strikers and Workers Cause Troops to be Sent - Strikers Occupy Krupp Works.

Copenhagen, April 9 - German Government troops are marching on Essen, where a collision has occurred between strikers and Christian workers organizations, the members of which are to continue at their employment. Strikers have occupied the Krupp Munition Plant, the message adds.

**DEBS LIKELY TO SERVE TERM**

Washington, April 9 - Indications today were that Eugene V. Debs, Socialist leader, early in May would have to start serving his ten year sentence as Attorney-General Palmer was on record as strongly opposed to execute clemency for the convicted war obstructionist.

**HENS CACKLE, PRICES HIGHER**

Chicago, April 9 - No such abundant supply of eggs ever before reached Chicago, as today, 73-75 cases. Notwithstanding the record-breaking arrivals, the market was slightly higher to-day than yesterday. Exporters were said to be taking liberal quantities to Europe.

War-Savings Stamps cost \$4.02 in March; \$4.03 in April; \$4.04 in May, and they may be purchased at any place displaying the Beaver-Triangle sign.
