Last night after the report last, the House went into Committee on the Commerce Bill. Opposition being made to the proposed Gold coinage of royal and marks, Mr. Hincks said he would abandon that part of the bill, which was to be introduced by the Bankers and co. His principal object was to introduce the decimal currency. The committee rose and reported progress so as to allow Mr. Hincks time to make this change.
