I believe in complete [separation of Church and State, and will defend to the utmost the rights and privileges that have been handed down to us by our forefathers. A simpler and less expensive method than the present system of preparing the voters lists is desirable, and the principle of one man one vote and the purity of elections I would heartily support. If elected I will support all good measures that may come before the House, independent of party consideration. As a retired farmer who has successfully caried on farming operations for a considerable portion of my life, I can well understand and appreciate the requirements of a farming community, and should the electors of this riding confide heir trust in me by securing my return as their representative the interests of the electors of this constituency shall be my first and last thought.
