HOUSEKEEPERS REJOICE.

—Eevolution in Fuel Claimed.

TACOMA, Wash., Sept. 25.—Geo. R. Cowley, pattern maker of this city, has invented a machine for making gas from wood. Besides 17,000 cubic feet of gas it will produce from a cord of firewood, worth \$2 per 1,000, 13 bags of charcoal and two gallons of tar, worth altogether \$48. A patent has been granted the inventor. The machine is a very simple one, consisting of a retort and purifying chamber with a tank to hold the gas. Cowles claims the machine can be used for domestic purposes by attaching it to a stove and that sufficient gas can be obtained during the cooking of three meals to last all day. He claims the machine will revolutionize the production of gas where wood is cheaper than coal. He is putting four machines in one of the largest buildings here.
