## GIANT CONTRACTS ARE AWARDED

Toronto and Niagara Power Co. Orders Generators.

## SIX OF VERY LARGE CAPACITY

The Canadian-Mexican Company  
Orders a Copper Cable 1,200  
Miles in Length.

New York, June 25. — The Toronto and Niagara Falls at Niagara, Ontario, which Col. H. H. McCall, of Toronto, is president, has just awarded a large contract for equipment to be installed in its power house at Niagara Falls, Ontario, and the Canadian side of Niagara Falls, from where energy will be delivered to transmit electric current to Toronto and intervening towns. The contract calls for six generators of 7,500 kilowatts capacity each, or 45,000 kilowatts in all.

The Canadian General Electric Company secured the contract.

The Mexican Light and Power Company, Limited, of Montreal, the \$12,000,000 enterprise of which Mr. James Ross is president, Mr. J. H. Plummer, of Toronto, vice-president, and Sir Geo. A. Drummond, vice-president of the Bank of Montreal; Mr. F. L. Wanklyn, formerly general manager of the Montreal street railways, and M. E. S. Clouston, general manager of the Bank of Montreal, are directors. They have just placed the largest single order for copper cable ever let in the States.

The order calls for no less than 1,500 miles of cable, weighing upwards of 2,000 tons. The cable is to be built from the company's Neexa power plant in Mexico, and run to the steel towers in spans of 500 feet, the contract for the cable was let to the Ansonia Brass and Copper Company, of Ansonia, Conn.

The Mexican Company's construction operations are among the most extensive ever initiated on this side of the Atlantic. The capacity of the Neexa plant will in the first instance be 45,000 horse power. Evidently there will be installed additional machinery which will permit of the generating of 80,000 horse power.

From an engineering standpoint the system will present many unique features. Some villages located in the vicinity of Neexa have been purchased by the company. They will be flooded, and the largest dam in the world will be constructed on their sites. Fully \$3,000,000, it is estimated, will be expended before the company begins to transmit the electric current.
