MAKE JAIL PLACE FOR HARD WORK
Inspector Smith Does Not Think Prisoners Should Have an Easy Time.
In the course of his annual report issued, Dr. Bruce Smith, inspector of prisons, who regularly visits the county jail in this city, comments upon the number of paupers kept in the jail, and also strongly censures the practice of sending insane persons to jail, mentioning 89 so sent in Toronto and 28 in Ottawa. The local county jail is not free from this trouble, as is well known. There are at present in the jail two old men who have each been there about two years. They are William Blackwell and Martin Lerner. The former was pronounced an idiot long ago by the judge, and was committed to the Orillia Asylum. On Oct. 2 of last year, Blackwell was again committed, but he has not yet reached Orillia, and there are no present prospects of his doing so.
Martin Tierney is 84 years of age, and was committed by Magistrate Love in 1902. He was pronounced insane by the county judge, but has never reached the asylum. Dr. McCullum and other medical men declared that Tierney's trouble was that his mind was weakened by age and that he should be sent to the asylum. There seems to be a general feeling, in accordance with the sentiments often expressed by Dr. McCullum, that there should be institutions for those afflicted with senile insanity. In the meantime, Tierney must be kept in jail, as if he would run away and could not be allowed with the other old paupers. Many are of the opinion that the Provincial Government should provide an institution which is neither an asylum, a jail, or an infirmary, but a home for old, weak-minded persons.
Dr. Smith also says that the number of persons confined in the jails is increasing more than it should from the fact that not enough work is provided for prisoners, and they get to look on the jail as a refuge, but an objectionable abode. The inspector says: "In several of the jails I have visited I have found able-bodied men spending their time in idleness and in idleness. It was told that the only work these prisoners had was in looking after their cells and sweeping out the corridors. There were more than 100 prisoners in the jail, and many of them were in the house of refuge in Stratford, the authorities say, because he would run away and could not be allowed with the other old paupers.
