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CANADIAN CASUALTY LIST

OTTAWA, May 8.—Casualty list issued from the Record Office late yesterday afternoon, and vary this morning, show the total of Canada's toll in the battle around Ypres by over three hundred names, and from the heavy list of missing in the 11th Battalion of Montreal it is evident that the record office is beginning to receive the names of the Canadians captured by the enemy.

There are again heavy numbers of men reported wounded.

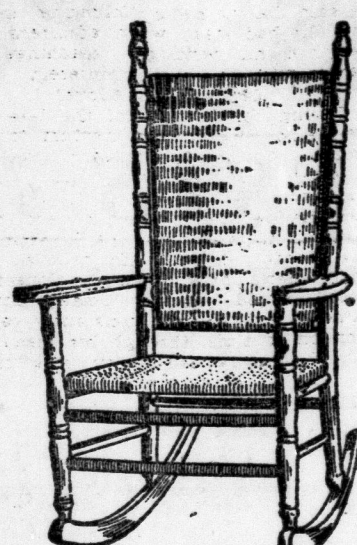

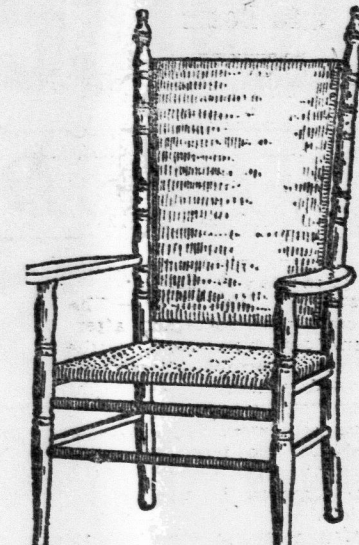
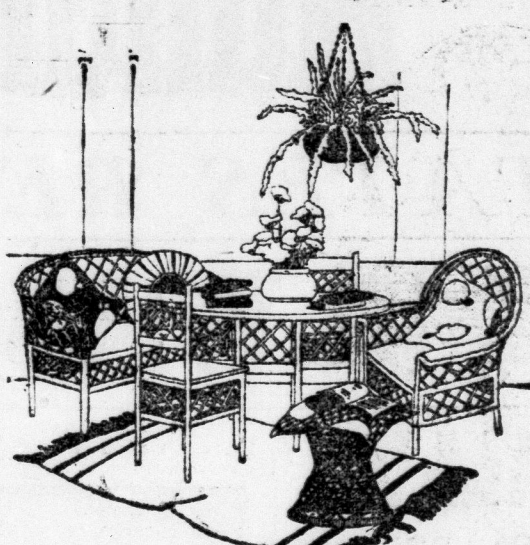
