

tutions of healing afford. Hospitals are not money-making concerns. They are not intended to supply employment or to enhance reputations. They do both these things, but their primary objects are to lessen human suffering and to

prolong human life. No citizen has performed a duty he owes his community until he has contributed to the local hospital. Unless he is a stockholder or a supporter, he has no right to expect favors when his turn arrives. best thing about it, however, is that the hospital, its doctors and nurses, and all its staff, will turn out to the last person to render aid to the meanest man in the neighborhood. If he i sick or injured, no questions are asked and no accounting demanded because of the lifetime of neglected

He may have cursed or laughed at the hospital, he may have treated its solicitors with scorn, he may have sneered at its needs. In spite of all this, the hospital will be there to strain its every facility to serve him when he is brought in as a patient. Look about you. Where is your nearest hospital? 
