

Bulgarians Mobilizing

Two Complete Classes Recruit
And One Regiment Called to Colors.

Frequent Aggression of Turkish Troops Reason For War-like Move.

Twenty Thousand Refugees Now in Bulgaria And More Coming.

Sofia, Oct. 10.—The War Office today ordered the complete mobilization of the first and second classes of reserves residing in the Kingdom of Bulgaria. This step was taken as a precautionary measure in view of the frequent provocations of the Turkish on the frontier.

The War Office has decided in view of the situation not to send home any of the reserves for the present. The Daily Telegraph says the authorities are surprised and concerned at the frequent aggressions of Turkish troops along the frontier. The Bulgarian ministry has forbidden the sale of arms and ammunicion to the enemy and has pointed out the deplorable results which such a course would have on the relations between the two governments at a moment when direct negotiations are proceeding.

It is estimated that 20,000 refugees are in Bulgaria. Of these 13,000 are in the Bulgarian and Varna districts. The remainder are distributed in the Rila, Samokov and other districts.

OPPOSE CHAMBERLAIN.
