The first chapter treats briefly but strikingly of the King, His Prerogatives and Disabilities. The king, we are told, stands at the head of Parliament, the three constituent parts of which are the Sovereign, the Lords and the Com-mons. According to the theory of the Constitution, Parliament is the King's Great Council summoned to deliberate with him on the affairs of the nation, to advise him as to the conditions, the wants and the wishes of his subjects; and a Bill does not become an act of Parliament, er in other words, the law of the land, even though it has passed through the House of Commons and the House of Lords, until it has received the Royal Assent.
