Had it not been for the war, a new Memorial Volume of the School would have been issued; but that, like the erection of the new buildings on the magnificent site at Norval, on the Credit River, has been deferred. In its stead is presented a new and enlarged edition of the "Roll of Pupils," which has been compiled from the Registers of the School and its other records as well as from supplementary information supplied by "Old Boys" and other persons. Among the latter are Mr. C. Henderson, Mr. Jackson, Mr. Principal Hutton, of University College, Toronto, Professor Baker, F.R.S.C., Professor Fraser, Mr. F. C. Watson, of Sarnia, Mr. W. Hart, of Guelph, Mr. T. Evans Bradburn, of Peterborough, the Librarian of the University of St. Andrew's, the Commandant of the Royal Military College, the Registrars of the University of Toronto, Queen's, and McGill, together with many mothers, wives, sisters, and daughters of "Old Boys" and Old Masters.

Fifteen years ago the former edition appeared under the editorship of a committee composed of Messrs. F. J. Campbell, Thos. E. Champion, Arnold Morphy, Harold Muntz, D. T. Symons, and A. H. Young. The basis of their work was the list which had appeared in the *Memorial Volume*, published about ten years earlier under the general editorship of the late Mr. G. Mercer Adam and the late Mr. George Dickson, Principal from 1885 to 1895. To this list were added, in 1901, the names of the pupils who had entered the School at Deer Park within the intervening decade.

Some ten years ago the present Editor undertook to construct a card index of the "Old Boys," provided that the Association paid for printing, postage, and clerical assistance. This it has done without stint to a sum amounting to more than two thousand dollars. In addition, a subscription for expenses was given by the late Mr. H. C. Hammond, at one time President of the Association. To contain the catalogue, a cabinet is being presented by Mr. R. S. Hudson, to whom, as well as to the present President, Mr. W. G. Gooderham, the Editor is indebted for ever ready sympathy in his undertaking.

For help with the military list the Editor is deeply indebted to Mr. G. E. Kingsford, to the Principal, and to his Secretary, Miss Philbrick. It has been carefully checked with the Departmental lists, as far as possible, by his own assistant, Miss L. Irene Taylor, of whose work in general he cannot speak too highly. In particular, Miss Taylor deserves mention
