IN ASSUNCIÓN, Paraguay, there are no deep sewers. The excreta mingled with the ashes is collected in pails, the whole being removed weekly by scavengers. The slop-water flows by open channels into a gutter in the center of the road.

DR. JANEWAY relates the case of a physician in New Mexico, who, after having attended a scarlet fever patient, went to see a patient in a town twenty miles distant, in which, as he subsequently took special pains to inquire, there was no scarlet fever; yet, one week after his visit, the disease appeared in the family which he had gone to see. Similar instances of carrying contagion long distances have been reported in the *Practitioner*, by physicians in rural districts in England.
