

possible; and through the development of mechanisms for accommodating public complaints. At the national level, the Canadian Government can support policy reform frameworks for law enforcement and the strict punishment for corruption. At village levels, grants can be provided for capacity building for villagers and village leaders with an aim to increase their capability in understanding and dealing with government policies, programs and projects, including mechanisms for gaining experience from people in other countries. Assistance can be channeled through CSOs that will facilitate people in their programs of building such capabilities.

3. Improve the capacity of local elections committees in order to carry out direct election for regional administrators (governors, regents and mayors).
4. Work to improve people's welfare through the management of environmental and natural resources in participatory and sustainable ways. This can be done by increasing the access of poor people in Indonesia so that they can directly manage environmental and natural resources, and also by increasing the capacity of the government and civil society for handling environmental issues.
5. Increase people's capacity for human rights protection and development, honour existing laws, and increase people's capability in using peaceful means for resolving conflicts.
6. And finally, CIDA should maintain and enhance its geographical concentration of projects, in consideration of the fact that Canada's yearly assistance for Indonesia amounts to only 25 million dollars.
