## MR. CLARK COMMENTS ON THE SITUATION IN HAITI

"Canada deeply regrets the decision of the Haitian Government to declare a state of siege in Haiti, particularly since this decision of the Haitian Government could call into question the holding of the general elections scheduled for later this year."

This was the reaction today of the Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Right Honourable Joe Clark, to the arrests of a large number of Haitian political figures following the announcement on Saturday of the state of siege.

"This action could amount to a significant setback for the process of encouraging, as quickly as possible, the development of truly democratic institutions - a process for which the Haitian Government has repeatedly declared their commitment", stated Mr. Clark.

Mr. Clark was also very concerned by reports indicating that some of the individuals arrested by the Haitian authorities had been maltreated. The Minister has asked the Canadian ambassador in Port-au-Prince to investigate the matter fully and to emphasize to the Haitian authorities Canada's expectations that democratic rights be respected. particularly deplorable the suspension of constitutional provisions protecting Haitian citizens against arrest and deportation.

Canada has already suspended all consultations with Haiti on government-to-government assistance following a series of tragic incidents which took place in September 1988. then, all Canadian aid to Haiti has been channelled through non-governmental and multilateral organizations.
