ment or any Member thereof, and any person or persons, referring in any way to the drainage of the Nation River, running through the Townships of Matilda and Winchester, in the County of Dundas, from the year 1904.

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency by such Members

of this House as are of the King's Privy Council.

On motion of Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. Marshall,

Ordered, That there be laid before this House, a Return showing the number of seizures made by the Department of Inland Revenue, during the years 1904, 1905, 1906, 1907 and 1908; the date of seizures; by whom seized; what the seizures consisted of; amount realized by the sale of such material seized; and how the seized material was disposed of.

The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Five hundred and fifty-four thousand six hundred and ninety-nine dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Post Office Department—Salaries, \$488,944; Contingencies (including \$50 a year to pay W. Cooch for inspecting letter carrier's boots), \$65,755, for the year ending 31st March, 1910.

6. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Seventy-five thousand dollars be granted

to His Majesty, for Exhibition, for the year ending 31st March, 1910.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. McIntyre (Perth) reported, That the Committee had come to several Resolutions.

Ordered, That the Report be received at the next sitting of the House.
