PRAYERS

One petition for a Private Bill was presented in accordance with Standing Order 67(1).

Mr. Chrétien, seconded by Mr. Mackasey, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-63, An Act to amend the Olympic (1976) Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Governor General pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Governor General recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the Olympic (1976) Act to authorize the issue of gold Olympic coins and to determine the selling price of the gold on the basis of the market price.

By unanimous consent, it was ordered,—That for the purposes of section (5) of Standing Order 58, an additional sitting day shall be added to the number of days allotted for the consideration of the business of supply in the period ending not later than December 10, 1975.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Sharp, seconded by Mr. MacEachen, it was ordered,—That the Standing Committee on External Affairs and National Defence be empowered to examine and report upon the full range of policies in the field of international development with particular reference to the economic relations between developed and developing countries.
