Forest Insect

Ravages Stopped

Thru a dormant, or pupal stage, becomes a beetle. This beetle then drills out thru the bark in July, and, emerging into the world, seeks a fresh tree and starts a new generation. With this "chain-letter" method, it soon infests a large area. The galgries or channels of the larvae girds the tree and kill it, and the beetles in the Ochoco national forest in central organ, the government is eliminating a danger which threatened to destroy millions of feet of timber.

Some authorities claim that the amount of timber killed each year by insects is equaled only by the annual loss, from forest fires. Among the first form forest fires a world in the tree, is sufficient.


