*THOU SHALT NOT KILL. * - Exodus, XX, 13.

DEARLY BELOVED. -

We resume again the course of our instructions on the Commandments.

The fifth Commandment forbids the murder or killing of our fellow-being. By murder we understand the deliberate and unjust act by which a sane person destroys the life of his fellow-man. This power over life and death God has always reserved to Himself, for He alone is the Creator of man. «And the Lord God formed man of the slime of the earth: and breathed into his face the breath of life, and man became a living soul.» (Gen. 11, 27.) «And God created him to His own image, to the image of God He created him.»
