

5. The word "month" shall mean a calendar month, and the word "year" a calendar year. "Month" or "year."

6. The word "holiday" shall include Sunday, New Years Day, Good Friday, Christmas Day, Dominion Day, the days appointed for the celebration of the birthday of Her Majesty and of Her Royal Successors, and any day appointed by proclamation of the Governor-General or Lieutenant-Governor as a public holiday or for a general fast or thanksgiving. "Holiday."

7. Words importing the singular number or the masculine gender only shall include more persons, parties or things of the same kind than one, and females as well as males and the converse. Number and gender.

8. The repeal of any by-law or part of a by-law shall not revive any by-law or provision of law repealed by such by-law or part of a by-law or prevent the effect of any saving clause therein. Repeal of a by-law not to revive by-law repealed by it.

9. Where a by-law is repealed wholly or in part and other provisions substituted, all officers, persons, bodies politic or corporate, acting under the old law, shall continue to act as if appointed under the new law until others are appointed in their stead, and all proceedings taken under the old law shall be taken up and continued under the new law when not inconsistent therewith; and all penalties and forfeitures may be recovered, and all proceedings had in relation to matters which have happened before the repeal in the same manner as if the law were still in force, pursuing the new provisions as far as they can be adapted to the old law. Effect of repeal of by-law on persons acting under it.

10. No offense committed and no penalty or forfeiture incurred and no proceeding pending under any by-law at any time repealed, shall be affected by repeal except that the proceedings shall be conformable where necessary to the repealing by-law; and that where any penalty, forfeiture or punishment has been mitigated by any of the provisions of the repealing by-law, such provisions shall be extended and applied to any judgment to be pronounced after such repeal. Offences committed and penalties incurred not affected by repeal.
