Thousands Greet Gen. White on His Arrival at Southampton.

Flags and Decorations were to be seen on Every Hand and the Mayor and Corporation in State Robes Bade Him Welcome.

TREMEMOUDOUS ENTHUSIASM SHOWN For the Man Whose Noble Efforts Gained for Him the Admiration of the World.

London, April 14.—The scene which greeted Gen. George White, when the steamer Dunvegan Castle, on which he left Cape Town, March 28, reached Southampton this afternoon, must have convinced him of the admiration of his countrymen for his gallant defence of Ladysmith during the long and trying siege of that place.

The General Greeted. As the steamer loomed up in the distance, with Gen. White standing on the deck, the enthusiasm of the waiting multitude broke loose, and a storm of cheering and singing and the sounding of sirens and whistles interrupted unceasingly until Sir George landed at 2.30 p. m.

HER BOY CRUORED TO DEATH

The Fenderless Trolley Does Its Deadly Work at the Junction on Saturday.

MRS. KYLE'S AWFUL DISCOVERY. Heard of the Accident, and, on Looking at the Victim, Saw It Was Her Son.

Toronto Junction, April 15.—Another child fell a victim to the fenderless trolley yesterday afternoon, near the corner of Pacific-avenue and Dundas-street, when Willie, the five-year-old son of Mr. Hugh Kyle of 142 Vine-avenue, had his life crushed out. The little fellow was with his sister and three other children when the accident happened. They had all just run out of Kimp & Whetter's butcher shop, and were crossing the road in front of the Lambton car, which was approaching from the east.

Dr. G. W. Cleland was summoned, and ordered the remains moved to Cuppin's undertaking rooms, where an inquest was opened last night, with John Paterson foreman. The coroner's verdict, after examining the spot, an adjournment was made until the 21st inst., when the body was to be buried in the C.P.R. cemetery, and telegraphed to Havelock. The motor was in charge of Motorman Robert Howland and Conductor R. Wiggins.

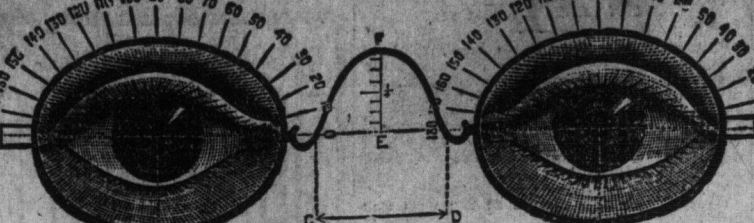
Reservoir Park. The cut, as finally applied by the board of control, will leave this, the North End Park, in a very precarious condition during the coming year.
