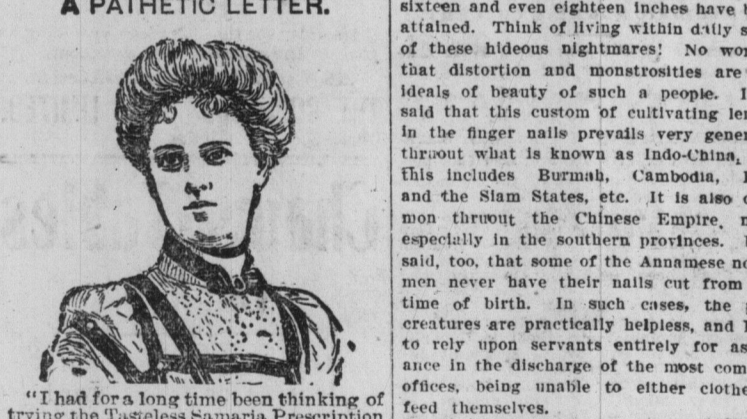

**INSURANCE COMPANIES WIN**

Won't Pay Losses on Cold Storage Warehouse at Watford—Had No Knowledge of a Previous Policy
