London, Aug. 23 .- A Blue Book contain-

ng the Postmaster-General's report for 1900 presents some interesting statistics.

The total number of postal packets delivered in the United Kingdom was 3,723, 817,000. The experiments with motor mail services are still unsuccessful. But re-

cent developments have encouraged the hope of the ultimate establishment of this class of service. The public deposited in the savings bank £40,516,436, and the total

amount due to depositors at the end of the year was £135,549,645. The Telegraph Department showed a deficit of £652,104. The total postoffice revenue was £15,995,-470, and the expenditure was £10,064,903.
