ARMIES CLOSE.

Gen. Oku's Headquarters, Oct. 25.—it is reported unofficially that the right army buried 3500 Russian dead, the central army 1500 and the left army about 5000.

The armies average 600 yards apart, and at places only 50 yards separate them. The men are constantly in the thenches, and by placing their caps on their bayonets draw scores of bullets from their opponents.
