The junior branch in St. Paul's parish has held monthly meetings, and have raised \$89 of which \$20 was given for home missions, while \$34 of the remainder paid off the debt on the piano purchased last year for the Sunday school. At Christmas a parcel of presents was sent to the family of a clergyman in the country.

WOODSTOCK. The secretary writes: "I have much pleasure in writing that the Sunday school house has been neatly and comfortably finished and has been occupied by the school and for other Church purposes since December. There is still a debt upon it which we hope in time to pay off. Two entertainments in connection with the association were given in the Hall, including a course of lectures, all of which amounted to \$106, sales of needle-work \$20, membership fees \$20, in all \$146."
