He is the Unanimous Choice of His Party for the Fourth Place --- Executive Authorized to Propose to Government a No-Bribery Election.

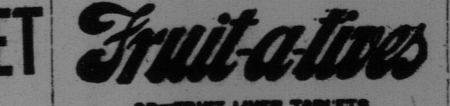

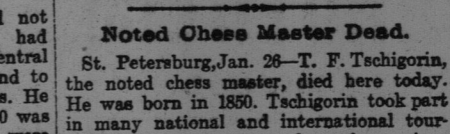

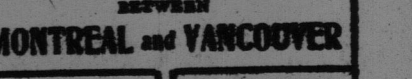
