PROF. SEXTON CHOSEN

He Will be the Head of the New Nova Scotia Technical School.

Halifax, N. S., May 9.—Professor Frederick H. Sexton, who in January last resigned the chair of mining in Dalhousia University to accept the professorship of metallurgy in the University of Missouri, has been appointed director of technical education in the province of Nova Society.

No man in the province has been more deeply interested in technical education than has Prof. Sexton. Born in New Boston, New Hampshire, Professor Sexton received his education in Cambridge (Mass.) and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, leading his class at the latter. For one year he taught in the institute of technology, then entering the employ of the General Electric Company, Schenectady, New York. Four years ago he was appointed to the chair in Dalhousie. By the appointment Professor Sexton also becomes principal of the government school of technology which is to be established at Halifax.
