Mr. Bonnell pointed out the tremendous interest in the subject of faith healing today evidenced in the rapid multiplication of faith healing cults. The subject he said, was enveloped in a fog of uncertainty. It felt it was the duty of the church to make clear its stand on this question. He sketched the history of eight different healing cults and showed that they all claimed remarkable cures.

OFTEN A FAD.

He acknowledged the fact of faith healing within guarded limits, but stated that unfortunately it has often become a fad. He quoted the statement of a distinguished French physician that 50 p. c. of the walking cases that came to his office could be cured only by a change of mental attitude

Mr. Bonnell stated that the most sane faith healing movement today was the Emmanuel Movement, where every patient appearing for faith cures is first examined by a competent physician, to see if the patient needs surgical or medical treatment for organic diseases and only when the doctor has completed his diagnosis, is the invalid taken on for faith teaching and prayer. In conclusion he stated that every blessing in the matter of healing, and the knowledge of God and of prayer, was available to the humblest Christian in all of the churches without the necessity of adopting irrational teachings of the modern faith-healing cults. The sermon was the second in the series on "Faith Healing a Fad or a Fact." Next Sunday night Rev.
