New York Man Who was Buried in "Charity" Grave Left Estate to Son.

New York, Oct. 5-For five years Louis Fields, seventy-two, worked for \$15 a week in a Salvation Army brica-brack shop at number 517 West 74th

a-brack shop at number 517 West 74th street. He lived alone in a scantily furnished rear room at number 486 West 50th street.

He died last week in Bellevue Hospital of pneumonia. The Salvation Army buried him in a "charity" grave at Mount Olivet. Today it developed he was worth \$10,000. His bank book showed a balance of \$4,700, and investigation disclosed \$2,000 in Liberty bonds and realty in the Bronx valued at \$3,800.

All the property was willed to an only son, Allan, whom the father had not seen in seven years. The Salvation Army is trying to find him. During the war he was said to have been employed in a government chemical plant somewhere on Long Island.
