"GRAFT" PROBE
IN ARGENTINA

Buenos Aires, Oct. 11.—Argentina has been having a graft investigation as a result of which it has been declared that 5,500,000 pesos have been "unduly" disbursed by former government officials who directed payments to contractors for building the capital here. The present government has announced its intention of bringing suits to recover the money allegedly improperly paid.
