- Q How long have you been married?
- A Oh. two years.
 - Q Have you made any attempt at any time to find another home for them?
 - A Not since I have been in the Army, Sir.
 - Q Where else were you?
 - A In Fort William, Sir.
 - Q And what were you doing there?
 - A I was working for a fellow named Rosenblat, and several places in Fort William and Port Arthur.
- Q Where was your wife when you were in Fort William?
- A She was living with me.
- Q She was living with you in Fort William?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q Where were you living 1943?
- A Fort William, I think, Sir.
- Q Where were you living in 1942?
- A I think it was still in Fort William.
- Q When did you go to Fort William?
- A Three or four years ago, Sir. I couldn't tell you the exact date.
- Q Well now, you have been working all the time , haven't you?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q Well, you should be able to fix the time fairly accurately. What was the first job you had in Fort William?
- A For Rosenblat.
- Q When did you get that uob?
- A I couldn't tell you, Sir.
- Q Were you ever in the Army before?
- A No, Sir.
- Q Have you been to Debert?
- A No, Sir.
- Q You lived in Winnipeg at one time, didn't you?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q When was that?
- A In '39, I guess, '38 or '39,Sir.
- Q Do you remember telling the Army Examiner that you were working in Winnipeg in January, 1943?
- A I don't remember, Sir.
