

WEEKLY WEATHER SYNOPSIS

Victoria Meteorological Office, January 11, 1907. The chief characteristic of the weather during the past week has been the marked decrease in temperature and the snowfall in the southern part of the province.

The weather continued unsettled and until the 5th, when the pressure began to increase in the north and a vast important area of high barometric pressure moving down covered British Columbia and nearly the entire western part of the continent and holding its position during the remainder of the week.

These conditions caused a great fall in temperature, especially in the west provinces; heavy snow fell on the coast and higher land in Vancouver Island. Skating prevailed for several days at Victoria and at New Westminster the continent and holding its position during the remainder of the week.
