DEATH OF MR. JOHN M'KANE.

Word has been received here of the death of Mr. John McKane, well-known in this province, in San Francisco, where he had been residing of late. Mr. McKane formerly lived at Newcastle and was well known in the North Shore towns. He was a native of Scotland, and was formerly manager of the merchants' Bank of Halifax. Resigning from the bank, he went to British Columbia and engaged in the mining business. He spent some time in Colorado and other parts of the West and amassed a fortune in his mining ventures. He returned to Newcastle a few years ago and for a time was engaged in the lumber business, but some two or three years ago he removed to San Francisco. His wife who was a daughter of the late Edward Sinclair, of Newcastle, was with him at the time of his death, which was due to pneumonia. Mr. McKane was about 52 years of age and his death will be heard of with surprise and regret by his many friends in this province.
