SAYS BRITISH USED 100,000 MEN

IN ATTACK ON TURKS' POSITIONS Berlin, Aug. 31, (By wireless to Say. despatch from Constantinople to the ville)—The British employed 100,000 men in their attacks on Turkish post-tions on the Gallipoli peninsula last Frankfurter Zeitung, and their losses were extremely heavy.
