Our Society in the person of its chief officer has been the object of the usual civilities on the part of sister societies and other corporations in this city.

We have been addressed on two occasions by the North America St. George's Union, enquiring in the first place for details as to our, organization, membership, revenue, and expenditure, and secondly, asking for information in regard to our district as a field for immigration. To both of these communications your Secretary replied. The North America St. George's Union is an organization composed at present of about fifteen St. George's Societies in the United States, and as many in Canada, united together for the advancement of objects, common to all, and representatives from which meet annually to confer upon any matters which may be in the interest of the St. George's Societies upon this continent.

Your Committee desire to express their sense of the careful and pains taking manner in which the Chairman of the Sub-Committee of Charity, Mr. Oliver, has attended to the duties of his office, viz: the superintendence of the distribution of the Society's charitable fund. The judicious expenditure of from \$500 to \$700 per annum in charity is a task of no little difficulty, but the fact that so large an amount is annually distributed to the deserving poor should be very satisfactory to those who, by becoming members of the Society are now contributors to this fund, and the operations of the Society generally should, in the opinion of your Committee, be of such interest as to induce a larger attendance at the various meetings, in a body composed of over one hundred persons now resident here.
