## JELLY, DAVID FINLAY. (North Regina.)

Of Irish descent. B. in the Tp. of North Dorchester, Co. of Middlesex, Ont., in 1847. Ed. at Harrietsville Public Sch., London Commercial Academy, Komoka Coll. and at the Toronto Military Sch. M., 1877, Ida Findlay, of Harrietsville, Ont. Was a teacher in the Harrietsville Public School for five years, and managing Dir. of the Belmont Flax Co. for three years. Settled in the N.W.T. in 1882 and has since been engaged in farming and stock raising. Was Presdt. of the Assiniboia Agric. Soc. in 1884–5. Sat in the N.W. Council from 1885 until elected to Leg. Assem., June 1888. Has been a mem. of the Advisory Council. An Independent.—Regina, N.W.T.

## LINEHAM, JOHN. (Calgary.)

B. in Perth Ont. Went to the North West in 1878 and has been engaged in business as a stock decler. Elected to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative.—Calgary.

## MITCHELL, HILLYARD. (Batoche.)

B. in the County of Huntingdon, England 1853. Came to Can. in 1872. Went to Manitoba in the same year as a volunteer, and served 12 months. In 1876 he settled in the Territories with Wm. Stobart & Co., and became a fur trader for a number of years in Peace River, Athabaska and Glass Lake countries. In 1882, connected still with firm of Stobart & Co., settled at Duck Lake permanently. Went through the N.W. Rebellion of 1885, taking an active part therein. Is a partner and manager of the firm of Wm. Stobart & Co., Indian traders, merchants and millers; proprietors of cattle and horse ranches at Duck Lake. Is a magistrate and coroner of the N.W. Territories. First elected for Batoche in 1888.
