

Created Q.C., 1853. A well known French Canadian *littérateur*; author of *Charles Guérin*; roman de mœurs *Canadiennes*; &c. Is a corresponding mem. of the Academy of Natural Sciences (New Orleans), a mem. of the Council of Public Instruction, and of the Board of Agriculture, L.C. Has been President of the *Institut Canadien Français*, Mont.; and of the Literary and Historical Society of Quebec. Was Solicitor General, L.C., from Nov., 1851, to Aug., 1853;—and Provincial Secy., Can., from latter date to Jan., 1855, when he retired from office, and in same year was appointed Superintendent of Education L. C., an office which he held from that time until the Union. Called upon to form the first local Govt. under the "British North America Act of 1867" for the Province of Quebec, July, 1867; and was appointed a mem. of the Ex. Council of Quebec with the offices of Provincial Secretary and Registrar, and Minister of Education. Sat for present seat in L. A., Can., from 1844 to July 1855, when he retired from Parlt. Returned by acclamation at last g. e. to Commons and Local House. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. Cartier.—*Quebec*.
