Pursuant to the Order of the Day the House was adjourned during pleasure and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act for the gradual enfranchise-" ment of Indians, the better management of Indian affairs, and to extend the provisions of "the Act 31st Victoria, chap. 42."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Hazen, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with several amendments, which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive them.

Ordered, That the Report be now received, and

The said amendments were then read by the Clerk as follow:

Page 2. Line 15. After "convictions" insert "and in carrying out the various sen"tences recorded."

Page 3. Line 50. After "Crown" insert "for the benefit of the tribe, band, or body "of Indians to which he or his father or his mother (as the case may be) belonged.

Page 3. Line ult. After "Crown" insert "for the benefit of the tribe, band, or body "of Indians to which he or his father or mother (as the case may be) belonged."

The said amendments being read a second time, and the question of concurrence put on

each, they were severally agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting Immigration" and Immigrants was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Chapais, seconded by the Honoraable Mr. Kenny, it

Ordered, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting the trial and "punishment of Juvenile Offenders," was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny,

it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House to-morrow.

The Honorable Mr. Campbell presented to the House, a Bill intituled: "An Act re"pecting the duties of Justices of the Peace out of Sessions in relation to Summary Convic"tions and Orders."

The Bill was then read for the first time.

Ordered. That the said Bill be read a second time to-morrow.

Then on motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable Mr. Anderson,

The House adjourned.
