

in some conspicuous part of the Senate, a list of the several Standing and Select Committees appointed during the Session.

Payment of Witnesses.

99. The Clerk of the Senate is authorized to pay every witness summoned to attend before a Committee, a reasonable sum for his attendance and also for his travelling expenses, upon the certificate or order of the Chairman of the Committee before which he shall have been summoned; and no witness shall be so summoned and paid unless a certificate shall first have been filed with the Chairman by a member of the Committee or of the Senate stating that the evidence of such witness is, in his opinion, material and important; and no witness residing at the seat of Government shall be paid for his attendance.

21. MESSAGES.

Bearers of Messages.

100. One of the Clerks of either House may be bearer of messages from one House to the other.

By whom Received.

101. Messages so sent are received at the Bar by one of the Clerks of the House to which they are sent, at any time whilst the House is sitting, or in Committee, without interrupting the business then proceeding.
