

Dino defence fights back

Scientists are still unsure of how dinosaurs became extinct. If the prehistoric variety are anything like the Calgary Dinosaurs, they didn't give up the ghost without a fight.

The Dinos used a quick start, a couple of good breaks and some stonewalling defence to even the Canada West final at one game.

"Tonight we got a few bounces. Last night we didn't seem to get any," said Dino assistant captain Barry Bracko. "Tonight we got the first goal and they had to play catch up."

Terry Jones started the Dino scoring 93 seconds into the opening frame as he one-timed a centering pass from Randy Seib behind Bear netminder Blair MacGregor. The shorthanded goal was the only specialty team goal of the night.

The Bears tied up the game four minutes later when Todd Gordon jammed a Marty Yewchuk centering pass behind Peter Fry. Gordon literally pushed the Dino goalie into the net, but the goal counted anyway.

Bracko and Gordon scored in the second period to make the score 2-2, but the pivotal, game-winning goal came at the 15:44 mark of the middle frame. Garnet Klassen centered the puck from the side of the Bear net and it bounced off of Sid Cranston's skate and behind MacGregor for the Dinos third goal.

"That was a lucky bounce," said Bracko, who's seen a lot of breaks go the Bears way in Varsity Arena. "It was just a matter of shooting the puck at the net and having it hit somebody. Stacey (Wakabayashi) or Sid (Cranston) usually shoot the puck and it goes off of the backboards and right on the other guy's stick and in the net."

"We won the face off cleanly," said Bear forward Doug McCarthy, "their guy just happened to throw the puck blindly and it went off of somebody's skate."

The Dinos got an insurance marker a-minute-and-a-half later when Steve Wheatcroft put one by MacGregor. They didn't need the insurance as their defence in the third period was fantastic.

The Bears tried to get the equalizer in the third period but the Calgary defence stood firm. The Dinos only allowed three Golden Bear shots on Fry in the third period. The Dinos only had three shots as well, but they weren't in the same position as the Golden Bears.

"In this type of a game, there's such tight checking that it's tough to score goals," McCarthy said.

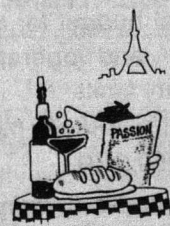
The top line of Cranston-Wakabayashi-McCarthy was not a factor in this game because of that tight checking.

"We're just getting a little frustrated in terms of our power play," said Wakabayashi. The power play went 0-for-Saturday with one shorthanded goal against, the opening goal by Jones. "We have to play more of a leadership role."

The game certainly cast some doubt on the series, especially after the way Alberta defeated Calgary in game one.

"I think both games were similar," said Dino head coach Willie Desjardins. "I think both teams could have won either game. I think we played better last night. It seems who controls the third controls the game."

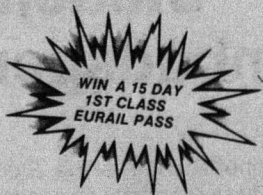
