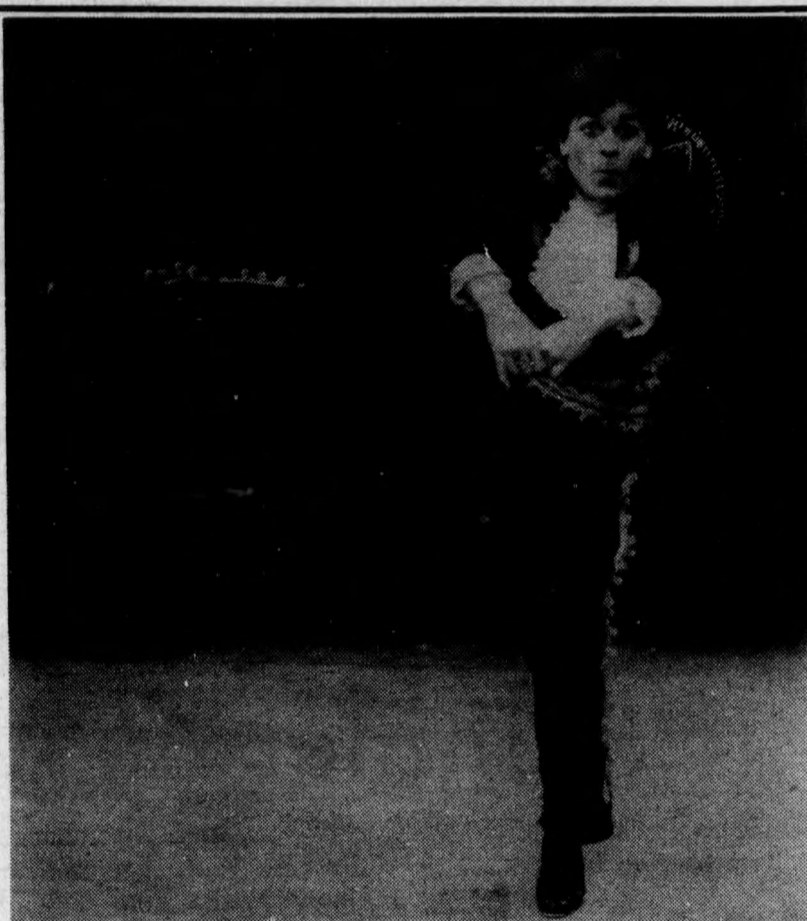

Theatre New Brunswick is currently preparing for a province-wide tour of an exciting new show performed by the National Tap Dance Company of Canada. THE BEST OF TAP, a show of music and dance which celebrates the 10th anniversary of National Tap, opens in Fredericton on November 15th and will be seen in nine communities before closing on December 8th.

The National Tap Dance Company of Canada is the first company dedicated to the art of tap dancing and the Company has travelled both nationally and internationally, taking its art form to the public with both education as well as entertaining programmes. From Lincoln Center's Metropolitan Opera House and Ottawa's National Arts Centre to community theatres and schools throughout Canada, the Company presents programmes with wide-ranging scope. The Company's repertoire currently consists of three individual programs: The Best of Tap which appears at TNB; The Tin Soldier, a full length work for children based on the classic Hans Christian Andersen tale (toured Canada and the United States and later filmed by CTV as "A Christmas Fantasy"); and Oliver Button Is A Sissy, another children's program based on the award-winning book by Tomie de Paola. A new work is being developed based on Sir Authur Conan Doyle's Sherlock Holmes



The National Tap Dance Company of Canada's Co-Founder and Artistic Director, William Orlowski is not only "one of the greatest tappers Canada has produced" as one critic hailed, but a teacher and choreographer as well. He will be featured in TNB's presentation, The Best of Tap appearing throughout New

Brunswick November 15 to December 8th. This 10th anniversary program is a special evening of music, dance and theatre that will include the works of four top choreographers including Brian Macdonald, John Stanzel, Paul Draper and William Orlowski.

Colorado String Quartet Playing Mem Hall

The Colorado Quartet, a New York-based string ensemble, will give a concert on Sunday, Nov. 16, in Memorial Hall at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton.

The performance, which begins at 3 p.m., is sponsored by the Creative Arts Committee of UNB and St. Thomas University. Tickets will be sold at the door. Prices are \$6 for adults, \$4 for senior citizens and school children, and \$2 for UNB and STU students.

The Colorado Quartet shot into the international spotlight

in April 1983 when it won two of chamber music's most prestigious awards: the Naumberg Chamber Music Award and first prize at the first-ever Banff International Quartet Competition. That was just seven months after two original members of the group, violinist Deborah Redding and cellist Sharon Prater, were joined by two new members, violinist Julie Rosenfeld and violist Francesca Martin.

On the program for the Memorial Hall performance are Haydn's Op. 33, No.6;

Shostakovich's Quartet No. 5; and Brahms' Quartet No. 3. It will be the first time that any string ensemble has performed the Shostakovich selection in Fredericton.
