Magic success formula does it in Uniform win

School Uniforms discovered a magic formula for success and moved into undisputed possession of third place in Mississauga men's basketball league competition.

School Uniforms' defensive display allowed Dixie to only 44 points, mainly by limiting the league's top point-getter, Gord Stewart, to a sub-par 17 point effort.

On the other end, John Budde popped in 27 to spark Uniforms to a 65-44 victory — good enough to give the squad 15 points, two ahead of Dixie.
