there in Spring, who would superintend, and see that they sowed in season, I would suggest that the Government send a person, for at least six brouths, who would do so, and also instruct them in creating buildines for their cattle, ploughing the land at the proper time, and in doing other thinks

as might be requisite.

Saw of opinion that they would perform the work, if a com-petent person were appointed for
the purposes specified, and if a
few provisions were given them when
at work; as at present, owing to
the fact that they have no one to look
after them on their Reserve, they are
constantly coming into the Settlements
and reglecting their work.

The reasont they had scattered, was powing to the want of provisions and supervision by some one competent to direct them in farming building operations.
