

is under cultivation and that the land is very fertile.

The land at Fisher's Grant, he states, is well adapted for these Indians and I would suggest that the Agent should be asked to state what he considers the actual value of the land applied for and also to report as to probable quantities and kinds of timber thereon, the quality of the soil and the area of good land &c.

The Accountant might be asked to state whether there are any funds available for the immediate purchase of land for these Indians and, if not, whether he can suggest any means of acquiring the land, if such a course is considered to be necessary without waiting for a vote in Parliament.
