

## <sup>Nov 11</sup> Air Cadets Visit Training School For Instruction

An hour's lecture and instruction in up-to-date methods of aircraft recognition was enjoyed by officers and personnel of the Belleville Air Cadets one evening late last week when 50 members of the corps, together with their officers, civilian instructors, and eight members of the local Rotary Club were entertained at No. 5 Initial Training School by Wing Commander A. J. Snetsinger, commanding officer, and his staff.

The boys spent a really enjoyable hour in the aircraft recognition room of the station and by their prompt recognition of many of the different types of aircraft flashed on the screen by the special projector, demonstrated that their training in this phase of cadet instruction had not been neglected. Aircraft recognition instruction is given the local cadet corps by Mr. Harold Mott, local Collegiate Institute teacher.

In addition to the instruction in aircraft recognition, special films on fighter pilot tactics and coastal command work were shown the cadets. Another film on Bell Alrocobra fighter planes was also shown. Following the instruction period the boys and their officers were entertained in the station mess with cadet members and officers expressing their appreciation to Wing Commander Snetsinger for the hospitality shown.
