Uplands, Ontario.	November 18th 1944		Good flying weather. This Unit was honoured by having two of its senior officers decorated - W/C A.D. Haylett, Chief Instructor, was awarded the Air Force Cross, and S/L H.R. Studer, O.C. No. 1 Squadron, was awarded a commendation.	
	November 19th 1944		Overcast. 8½ hours solo flying. R.C. and Protestant services were attended by all personnel on the station, and not on duty.	
	November 20th 1944		Overcast, hazy. Uplands mens basketball team defeated A.F.H.Q. 46 to 24 in an exhibition game.	
	November 21st 1944		Overcast, continuous snow, flying washed out all day. W/C H.F. McClelland reported on the Unit as C.E.O. replacing W/C T.F.L. Bellow who is retiring. The entertainment committee held a meeting today and a special Christmas party committee was elected with S/L H.R. Studer as chairman. It was decided to have the Christmas tree and party for the children of the Unit personnel on Tuesday, December 19th. No. 168 Squadron from Rockcliffe defeated our Maintenance team, 32 to 12, in an exhibition game at Rockcliffe.	
	November 22nd 1944		Overcast, snow showers. Flying washed out all day. There was a record attendance at the Music Appreciation Hour in the W.D. Recreation Centre. Under the able guidance of S/L R.L. Puxley, S. Ad. O., this has become one of the most popular of the weekly entertainments.	
	November 23rd 1944		Overcast, snowflurries. It was with great regret that this Unit saw the departure of W/C T.F.L. Bellow, Chief Engineering Officer. He was one of the "pioneers" at Uplands and one of its most popular officers who took the welfare and well-being of the airmen and airwomen very much to heart. He will be truly missed by everyone.	
	November 24th 1944		Overcast, snowflurries. Five hours dual flying. Commanding Officer's parade held in the morning and Maintenance Squadron remained for inspection by the Commanding Officer. A District Court-Martial was convened at this Unit for the purpose of trying Cpl Nadon and LAC Seguin. The latter has been remanded to a later date. Regular "Friday Nighter Dance" held in the Recreation Hall for Station personnel and guests.
