

the Saguenay on the one side, and the River St. Maurice on the other, should be explored.

But at this late period of the Session, your Committee can do no more than advert to these latter great objects, generally leaving it to the wisdom of the Executive Government, which possibly may deem the matters to which your Committee have turned their attention of sufficient magnitude and importance to the welfare of the Province and the development of its agricultural resources, to adopt, in the mean time, such line of conduct as may be conducive to those purposes, which your Committee are persuaded there is a strong tendency in the population of this Province to pursue, if properly directed, and to which some future Legislature may give effect.

All which is nevertheless humbly submitted.
