A Graded System of Teaching

THE Curriculum of the School provides complete and carefully graded courses of instruction. leading up from the Kindergarten to the Sixth Form, where the pupils are prepared for the University entrance examinations. The parts of the system are so related to one another, and the grading is so carefully arranged, that girls who enter the Junior Department, and move up the School. should be able eventually to take Honour standing in the University Matriculation Examination. without being subjected to undue strain at any point. For the best results, therefore, the complete course is recommended. For those who enter the School at an intermediate stage every provision is made to bring them as soon as is practicable into harmony with the

School system, so that when they move up to the higher classes they may be as nearly as possible on an equality with their classmates.
