CARSONBY. A country post office in North Gower township, Carleton County, 20 miles south of Ottawa, the county seat, and nearest banking point, and 8 west of Osgoode station, on the St L & O Ry, its nearest railway point. Grain and live stock are shipped. Stage twice a week to North Gower, 4 miles south. Mail semi-weekly. Benjamin Eastman, postmaster.

CARSWELL. A country post office in McNab township, Renfrew County, 46 miles south-east of Pembroke, the county seat, and 7 south-east of Renfrew, the nearest railway and banking point. Settled in 1874. It has a common school and ships eggs. Population, 25. Mail semi-weekly. David Carswell, postmaster.

CARTERET. A discontinued post office in Chapman township, Parry Sound District, 6 miles north of Magnetawan, the nearest post office, which see for Directory.

CARTERTON. A country post office on St Joseph's Island, in Algoma District, 36 miles south-east of Sault Ste Marie, the

county seat, and 6 miles from Hilton, the nearest shipping point. Settled in 1840. It contains a common school and ships grain and timber. Population, 30. Mail weekly. Daniel McPhail, postmaster.

Settled in 1885. It contains Catholic and Methodist churches, and a common school, and ships lumber and ore, a weekly newspaper, the *Gazette* is published. Population, 700. Express, Dominion. Mail daily. F G Sinclair, postmaster.
