English Abroad.—John Bull is certainly a strange specimen of humanity, when contrasted with other nations. It is impossible for one moment to mistake him it he has an and manner peculiar to binself; he enters the saloon of the hotel with a sturdy step and straightforward look, taking no notice of the salutation that foreigners usually make when a stranger enters. You can read his supreme contempt for foreigners and every thing foreign on its brow.
